

## Information about applying for an extended deadline for the mandatory roadworthiness test

### **The vehicle is illegal to use if the deadline has expired**

If the deadline expires and the vehicle becomes illegal to use, you cannot use the vehicle even if you apply for an extended deadline. Your application must be approved for the vehicle to be legal to use again.

### **As a main rule, you can only be granted an extension of the deadline for the mandatory roadworthiness test in cases of serious illness**

The deadline for the mandatory roadworthiness test is final, and as a main rule we do not grant extensions. It is up to you how early you wish to carry out the test, as long as the vehicle is tested and approved before the deadline. However, if you suffer from serious illness and can present a medical certificate that confirms this, you can apply for an extension.

### **In what cases can you not apply for an extension?**

For example, you will not be granted an extension of the deadline for the test based on:

- waiting time for test sessions at the garage
- waiting time for components needed to repair the vehicle
- your stay abroad
- your financial situation
- seasonal vehicles that are in winter storage (veteran cars, motorhomes)

It can take up to four weeks to process an application for an extension.
